Person responsible for communication and knowledge management for the right to education in Costa Rica

Internship location: San Jose, Costa Rica

Host organization: Sulá Batsú

Sulá Batsú is a social and solidarity economy company founded in 2005 with the aim of encouraging and strengthening local development by working with organizations, social enterprises, community networks and social movements at national, regional and global level. This objective is achieved using different approaches: digital technologies, art and culture, collective construction and management of knowledge and social and solidarity economy.

Position Title: Person responsible for communication and knowledge management for the right to education

Mandate: The specific objective of this initiative is to empower Costa Rican civil society to better support marginalized groups (particularly girls and women), through more strategic and safer use of ICT.

During the 4 months internship abroad, the intern will be provided with adequate accommodation and a safe and secure workplace in San Jose.

The intern will work with Sulá Batsú to support the organizations' research work, communication and management of their knowledge and documents. They will research the environmental responsibility of the digital industry, the circular economy with a focus on gender issues; it will support the different stages related to the implementation of research projects, the development of tools and methodologies for the collection of data and documents to draw up bibliographies. They will compile and analyze the synthesis of the qualitative and quantitative data collected. They will produce reports and other information documents to report on research findings. They will develop, with the team, tools to disseminate the results, document, evaluate the work carried out and manage the organization's knowledge.

In this context, the trainee's main responsibilities will be to implement methods and techniques to identify, recover, organize and redistribute knowledge within the organization; to identify, organize, and implement tools so that the knowledge of the organization's employees and volunteers is valued; to manage, identify, classify this knowledge on themes relating to gender, migration, violence, drug trafficking, human rights, extractivism, etc., in Central America.

The intern will have, among other things, the opportunity to:

• Strengthen the organization's communication strategy on different issues with the communications manager to contribute to strategic thinking in order to increase the organization's presence in digital and social media, particularly on issues affecting freedom expression and violence against women, girls and environmental rights defenders

Required Skills: The candidate must have a strong interest in the field of international development, human rights, education, but also in communication, research and analysis. They must speak Spanish and have good writing skills.

Training before departure and upon return from the internship

Before leaving, participants have the chance to participate in a 4-weeks professional training course (in french) led by instructors recognized in their field, during which they will address diverse themes as per the following program.

The IYIP also aims to help participants integrate the job market when they return. In this context, participation in the program includes workshops designed to improve interview skills and strengthen job search tools.

In addition, participation in the IYIP covers:

- Travel and medical insurance costs;
- Plane tickets:
- Mandatory vaccinations*;
- The cost of the visa, if necessary;
- The organization of accommodation;
- Daily living expenses;
- Personalized follow-up during your international stay.

Duration of international stay: 4 months

To be eligible for the International Youth Internship Program (IYIP), the candidate must:

- Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident;
- Be facing barriers to employment by belonging to or identifying with a group of people who face discrimination such as people living with disabilities, Indigenous people, racialized youth and members of the 2SLGBTQI+ community.
- Be between the ages of 18 to 30 years old at the time of final selection (i.e. at the time of signing the contract by the intern and Alternatives);
- Have never participated in the IYIP (with some exceptions: see our FAQ section)

Language: good knowledge of written and spoken Spanish required.
