Project Assistant Intern for the Right to Education in Latin America

Internship location: São Paulo, Brazil

Host organization: Campaña Latinoamericana por el Derecho a la Educación (CLADE) acts for the realization of human right to education and the strengthening of democracies in 18 countries of Latin America and the Caribbean, by articulating national forums, regional networks and international member organizations and by promoting actions for a universal, free, inclusive and quality education throughout life, without any form of discrimination. CLADE is part of the Global Campaign for Education, an international network that operates in 124 countries, and is currently forming its steering committee.

Position Title: ***Project Assistant Intern for the Right to Education in Latin America***

IMPORTANT - Language: good knowledge of written and spoken Spanish required. Knowledge of Portuguese is a plus.

Mandate: The intern will work closely in São Paulo with the Campaña Latinoamericana por el Derecho a la Educación (CLADE) and its member organizations. They will work within the organization on three priorities subjects related to their capabilities:

- a) engage in CLADE's Youth Working Group by planning and supporting youth-led activities,
- b) support the development and the implementation of a training program on the right to education of migrant people, as well as its subsequent regional campaign
- c) strengthen the organization's network in three key areas: digitization, climate justice and gender transformative education.

During their 3- months internship in Brazil, interns will benefit from adequate accommodation and a safe and secure workplace in São Paulo.

The intern will, among other things, have the opportunity to focus on the following areas:

- Take part in CLADE's work with young people, supporting the development and implementation of CLADE's Youth Working Group activities
- Engage in the conception, development and implementation of a regional training program on the right to education of migrants, providing logistical assistance for the virtual sessions, follow up on participants and supporting the development of a regional campaign on the right to education of migrants
- Support CLADE's work previous to its general assembly. This includes the conception, development and realization of previous online events on CLADE's key thematic areas, the development of concept notes and synthesis documents of the events, and logistical support for the online sessions. Also, support CLADE's regional team on planning the general assembly that will be held in September.
- Strengthening CLADE's work on the governance of digital technologies in education, following up with key allies on key events and advocacy processes
- Support CLADE's work on gender-transformative education, following up with key allies on the XVI Regional Conference on Latin American and Caribbean Women
- Assist CLADE's regional team on its work regarding the linkages between right to education and climate and environmental justice, following up on CLADE's engagement in

COP30, the People's Summit and the Pan Amazonian Social Forum

Required Skills: The candidate must have a strong interest in international development and gender equality, as well as in communications, media and research. They must speak Portuguese or Spanish and have good writing skills.

Training before departure and upon return from the internship

Before leaving, participants have the chance to participate in a 2 weeks (10 business days in total) professional training course (in French and English with accommodations) led by instructors recognized in their field, during which they will address diverse themes as per the following program.

The IYIP also aims to help participants integrate the job market when they return. In this context, participation in the program includes workshops designed to improve interview skills and strengthen job search tools.

In addition, participation in the IYIP covers:

- Travel and medical insurance costs;
- Plane tickets;
- Mandatory vaccinations*;
- The cost of the visa, if necessary;
- The organization of accommodation;
- Daily living expenses;
- Personalized follow-up during your international stay.

Duration of international stay: 3 months

To be eligible for the International Youth Internship Program (IYIP), the candidate must:

- Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident;
- Be facing barriers to employment by belonging to or identifying with a group of people who face discrimination such as people living with disabilities, Indigenous people, racialized youth and members of the 2SLGBTQI+ community.
- Be between the ages of 18 to 30 years old at the time of final selection (i.e. at the time of signing the contract by the intern and Alternatives);
- Have never participated in the IYIP (with some exceptions: see our FAQ section) Interested?
